









Santa Clara Rural Roads Field Trip

Showcasing best management practices for rural road improvement and maintenance

Meet at Miller Point Parking Lot, Lexington Reservoir County Park, Los Gatos

Registration Fee of \$10.00 (pre-registration required, but can pay at the door)

This is a unique opportunity for rural residents, agricultural producers, and agencies responsible for maintaining and improving generally unpaved roads to view recent and in-progress road improvements constructed with practices intended to produce environmentally and hydrologically sound roads for residential, agricultural and recreational



purposes. Well-constructed roads can help reduce erosion and decrease sediment in local reservoirs and streams, improve water quality and wildlife habitat, reduce ongoing maintenance costs, and enhance the ability of emergency responders to provide services.

Transportation will be provided by charter bus. The parking area is fairly remote, so please do not leave valuables, bikes, etc. in or on your vehicles. Both stops will involve non-strenuous walking of up to 1¼ mile, so please wear appropriate shoes and clothing. Participants are responsible for bringing their own lunch, sunscreen, and personal items. Water and snacks will be provided. Directions to the parking lot are here.
